However, at no time, under any circumstances, will physical discipline be used by instructors or cadet leaders to correct behavior or to punish cadets.

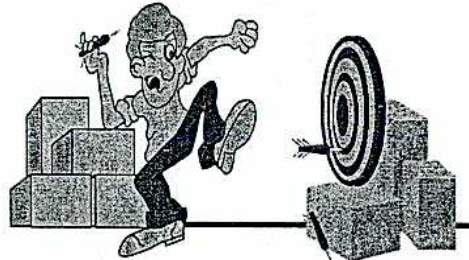

2008 – 2009 Unit Goals

- **Cadet 1:** Increase, to 60% of the corps, cadets with 3.0 or higher GPA with at least 20 in National Honor Society and 25 in Kitty Hawk Air Society
- **Cadet 2:** 100% seniors graduate on time (at least one ROTC scholarship), accepted to college, enlist, and sponsor a drill meet
- **School 1:** Maintain unit enrollment at 150 or above with at least 60 freshmen cadets entering the corps
- **School 2:** Increase to 124 (75% of corps) the number of cadets participating in school-wide service clubs, student organizations, and Varsity/JV sports
- **Community 1:** Increase participation in community service activities to 100 cadets, increase service hours performed by 10% to 2900, and sponsor a drill meet
- **Community 2:** Publish articles about cadets in 100% of the PTSA Newsletters, 75% of the school's newspapers, and in one state or national newspaper or publication



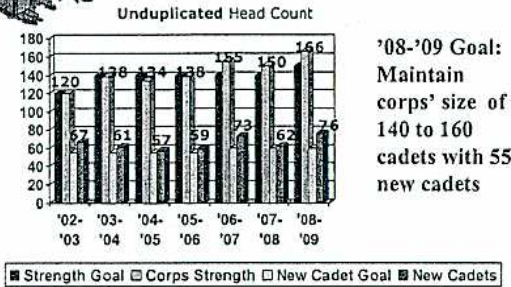
NC-939 METRICS



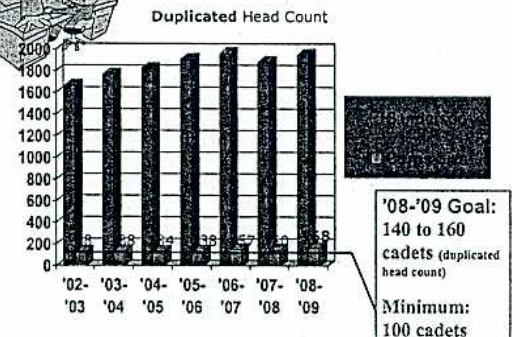
How we did in accomplishing our 2008 – 2009 unit goals



NC-939 Corps Size



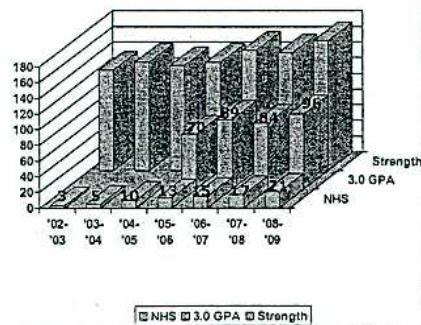
NC-939 Viability

'08-'09 Goal: Achieve 60% of the corps with 3.0 or higher GPA with at least 20 in the National Honor Society and 25 in KHAS

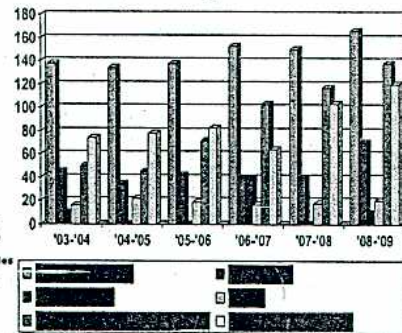
Impact: 96 cadets with a GPA of 3.0 or higher & 21 in NHS. 26 members in KHAS.

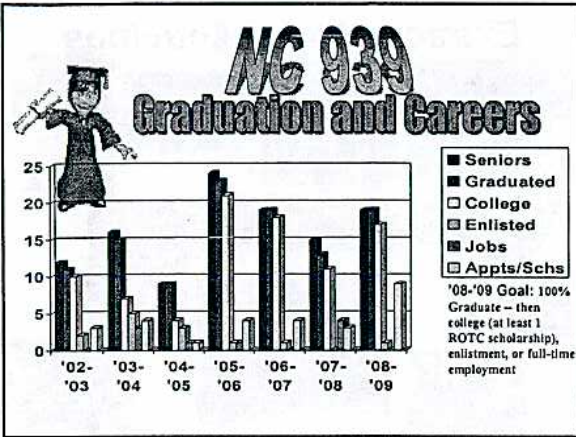


NC-939 Cadet Participation

'08-'09 Goal: Increase to 124 (75% of corps) the number of cadets participating in school-wide service clubs, student organizations, and Varsity/JV sports

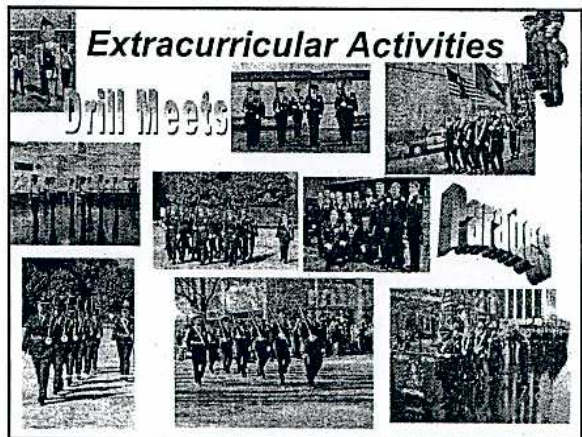
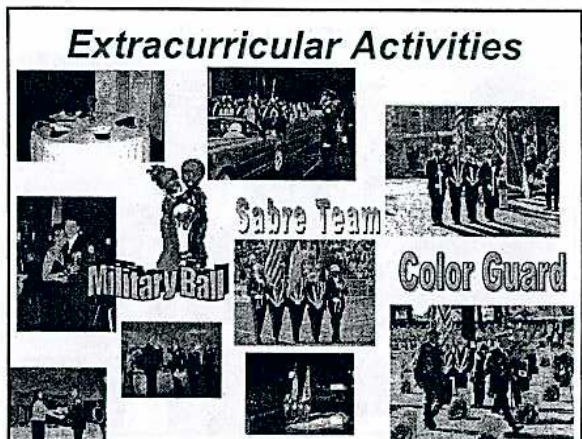
Impact: Exceeded - Cadets selected as Captains in the Varsity football, track, and swim teams. 138 cadets (86% of the corps) participated in 358 school-wide activities including 70 cadets on corps' competitive drill team. 107 cadets also participated in non-AFJROTC activities.

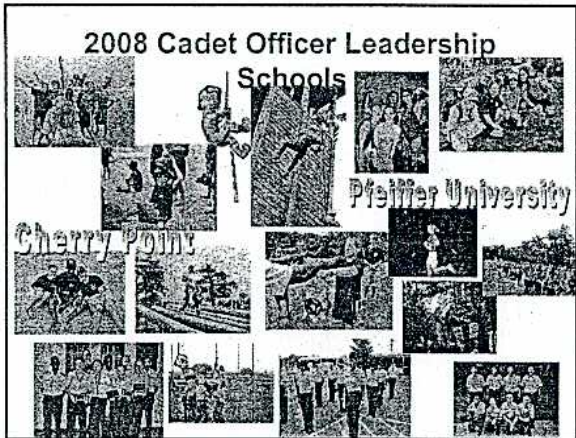
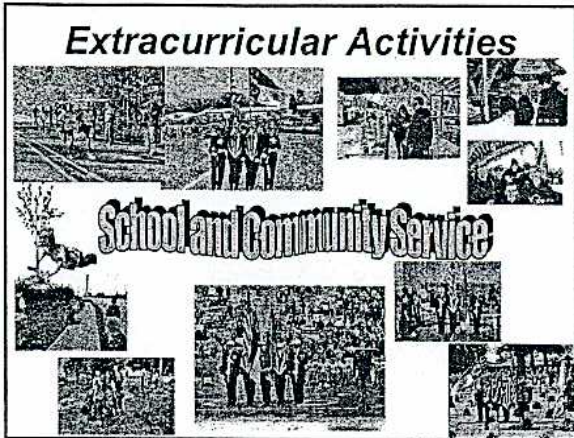
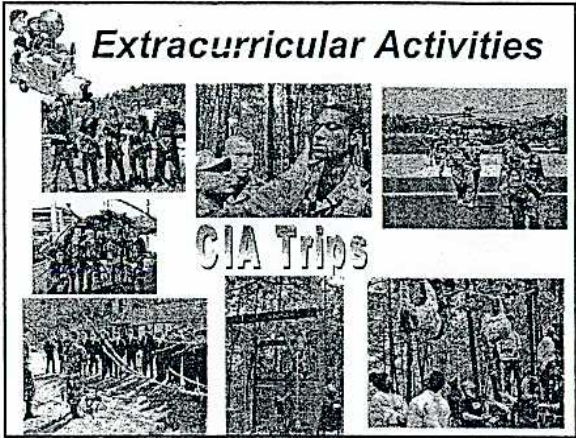




- ## Notable Accomplishments
- AFJROTC Distinguished Unit seven years
 - Twelve cadets attended AFJROTC Honors Camp
 - 59.7% of the corps had 3.0 GPA or higher at the end of first semester
 - \$3.8 million in ROTC scholarships and AFA appointments over last seven years
 - 2642 hours of school and community service accomplished last year (3600 hours so far this year)
 - 1st, 2nd, and/or 3rd place overall at drill meets in each of last six years
 - 2005-2006 Homecoming Queen was a cadet
 - 2007-2008 Student Body President and NHS Vice President were cadets
 - 1st choice of NCHSAA for Championship Game Color Guards
 - Twelve years participation in the Adopt-A-Highway program

- Air Force
 - Sanderson High School
 - Enrollment – 140-170 students (cadets)
 - Transfer students – 15-20 students /annually
 - Broughton High School
 - Enrollment – 100-110 students (cadets)
 - Transfer students – 1-5 students /annually
- Navy
 - Cary High School
 - Enrollment – 125-150 students (cadets)
 - Transfer students – 7-10 students /annually
- Army
 - Wake Forest – Rolesville High School
 - Enrollment – 85-95 students (cadets)
 - Transfer students – 10-15 students /annually

Quick Facts/Updates

- Each year, 95-99% of WCPSS JROTC cadets graduate on time.
- JROTC instructors do not recruit students to enlist in the military.
- JROTC curriculum focus – Citizenship, Leadership, Team Work, Character Education, Physical Fitness, History, specific instruction based on branch of military (Example: Air Force – Aerospace)
- Students can fulfill their Healthful Living graduation requirement by successfully completing JROTC/HL I and JROTC/HL II.
- Transfers – Students may successfully receive a transfer to participate in JROTC. However, if at any time, the transfer student elects to dis-enroll from JROTC they must return to their base school.
