Raleigh, NC – Wake County Commissioner candidate Jack Nichols spoke “honestly” about a future that includes him as a Wake County Commissioner. Jack Nichols in his own words:

“At some point in time in the next couple of years we’re going to have to have a school bond referendum. A school bond referendum automatically has an impact on folks that are on fixed incomes because those property taxes translate into a cost. So I think it’s grossly unfair to ever talk about a school bond referendum and not talk about how you’re going to pay for it. Well let me tell you right now, if we had a school bond referendum, we need to be honest and tell folks, it’s going to require a property tax increase.”
